**KIAVAH WILDERNESS LEGAL DESCRIPTION**

**October 28, 2003**

Legal description of the Kiavah Wilderness, as designated by Public Law 103-433, Section 102 (31) of the California Desert Protection Act of 1994, located within the Sequoia National Forest, in the County of Kern, State of California, and more particularly described as follows:

Mount Diablo Meridian

T. 26 S., R. 35 E., sections 12, 13, 24, 25 and 36;

T. 26 S., R. 36 E., the W1/2 and the SE1/4 of section 1; sections 2 to 5 inclusive, Sections 7 to 36 inclusive;

T. 26 S., R. 37 E., sections 19, 20, 29 to 32 inclusive;

T. 27 S., R. 35 E., sections 1, 12 and 13;

T. 27 S., R. 36 E., sections 1 to 11 inclusive, Sections 14 to 18 inclusive, partly unsurveyed; Sections 20 and 21;

T. 27 S., R. 37 E., sections 5 and 6.

Containing approximately 44,827 net acres, as determined by Geographic Information System query. All of the land contained within this description is federally owned land.

EXCEPTING therefrom the following described road corridors:

THE CAP CANYON ROAD (25S48) CORRIDOR:

BEGINNING at a point on the north line of section 7, T. 26 S., R. 36 E., said point also being 30 feet westerly, and at right angles from the centerline of the Cap Canyon Road;

THENCE (1) southeasterly, parallel with and 30 feet southwesterly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately one-half mile to the end of said road;

THENCE (2) on a 30-foot-radius curve, concave to the northwest, around the end of said road, to a point 30 feet northeasterly from the end of said road;

THENCE (3) northwesterly, parallel with and 30 feet northeasterly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately one-half mile to its intersection with the north line of said section 7.

THE COW HEAVEN CANYON ROAD CORRIDOR:

BEGINNING at a point on the east line of section 5, T. 27 S., R. 37 E., said point also being 30 feet northerly and at right angles from the centerline of the Cow Heaven Canyon Road;

THENCE (1) westerly, parallel with and 30 feet northerly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately one mile to the end of said road;

THENCE (2) on a 30-foot-radius curve, concave to the east, around the end of said road, to a point 30 feet southerly from the end of said road;

THENCE (3) easterly, parallel with and 30 feet southerly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately one mile to its intersection with the east line of said section 5.

THE SAGE CANYON ROAD (COUNTY ROAD 5932) CORRIDOR:

BEGINNING at a point on the west line of section 13, T. 27 S., R. 37 E., said point also being 30 feet northerly, at right angles from the centerline of the Sage Canyon Road;

THENCE (1) generally northwesterly, parallel with and 30 feet northerly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately one and one-quarter miles to the end of said road;

THENCE (2) on a 30-foot radius curve, concave to the southeast, around the end of said road, to a point 30 feet southwest from the end of said road;

THENCE (3) generally southeasterly, parallel with and 30 feet southerly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately one and one-quarter miles to its intersection with the west line of said section 13.

THE HORSE CANYON (COUNTY ROAD 5937) - McIVERS SPRING ROAD (36E52) CORRIDORS:

BEGINNING at a point on the east line of section 21, T. 27 S., R. 36 E., said point also being 100 feet northerly, at right angles from the centerline of the Horse Canyon Road;

THENCE (1) generally northwesterly, parallel with and 100 feet northerly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately two and one-half miles to a switch-back to the east at 35°34'57" North latitude, and 118°07'24" West longitude (NAD 83 coordinates);

THENCE (2) generally northeasterly, parallel with and 100 feet southeasterly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately one-half mile to the McIvers Spring Jeep Trail;

THENCE (3) generally northerly, to northeasterly, to easterly, parallel with and 30 feet easterly, at right angles from the centerline of said road, approximately five miles to the end of the road at McIvers Spring;

THENCE (4) on a 30-foot radius curve, concave to the west, around the end of the road, to a point 30 feet northerly from the end of said road;

THENCE (5) generally westerly, to southwesterly, to southerly, parallel with and 30 feet northerly, approximately five miles, to a point easterly of and 100 feet, at right angles, from the road accessing a communication tower;

THENCE (6) northerly, parallel with and 100 feet easterly, at right angles, from the road to the communication tower, approximately one-sixteenth mile to the end of said road;

THENCE (7) on a 100-foot radius curve, concave to the south, around the end of said road, to a point 100 feet westerly from the end of said road;

THENCE (8) southerly, parallel with and 100 feet westerly, at right angles, from the road to the communication tower, approximately one-sixteenth mile to a point 100 feet westerly from the aforementioned Horse Canyon road;

THENCE (9) generally southwesterly, parallel with and 100 feet northwesterly, at right angles, from the Horse Canyon road, approximately one-half mile to the aforementioned switch-back at 35°34'57" North latitude, and 118°07'24" West longitude (NAD 83 coordinates);

THENCE (10) generally southeasterly, parallel with and 100 feet southerly, at right angles from the centerline of the Horse Canyon Road, approximately two and one-half miles to the intersection of the east line of said section 21.

#### HIGHWAY 178 ROAD CORRIDOR:

Any portion of section 1, T.26S., R.36E., or section 20, T.26S., R.37E., lying within 300 feet, as measured at right angles, from the centerline of Highway 178.

The above described area has been plotted on 1:24,000 scale topographic maps (two sheets), entitled "KIAVAH WILDERNESS (10/28/2003)", which are attached hereto and made a part hereof this description.
