Two wildernesses in Nevada designated under Public Law 109-432, December 20, 2006:

- Red Mountain Wilderness, Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest
- Currant Mountain Wilderness, Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest

One wilderness in Utah designated under Public Law 107-334, December 16, 2002:

- Mount Nebo Wilderness, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest Service

One wilderness in Utah designated under Public Laws 105-355 November 6, 1998 and 108-95 October 3, 2003:

- Mount Naomi Wilderness, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest

One wilderness in Utah designated under Public Law 111-11, March 30, 2009:

- Cottonwood Forest Wilderness, Dixie National Forest Service

One wilderness in California under Public Law 111-11, March 30, 2009:

- Magic Mountain Wilderness, Angeles National Forest
