BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

LITTLE LAKE GEORGE WILDERNESS

The Little Lake George Wilderness is located on the Ocala National Forest, Putnam County, Florida in Township 12 South, Range 26 East, Tallahassee Meridian.

The Wilderness Boundary is delineated on U.S.G.S. 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2 minute topographic quadrangle Welaka (modified for USDA Forest Service use). Where actual field survey bearings and distances were not available, courses were digitized from the Florida State Plane Coordinate System, East Zone from the above named quads and therefore should be considered approximate. Survey bearings are based on True North and digitized bearings are based on Grid North.

Commencing at Triangulation Station LEG, a standard bronze disk set in concrete on the west shore of Little Lake George at geodetic latitude of $29^{\circ}26'10.634''$ North and geodetic longitude of $81^{\circ}41'17.456''$ West, which is located approximately 7,920 feet northwest of Fort Gates in fractional section 22, T. 12S., R.26E.

Thence run west approximately 53 feet to THE POINT OF BEGINNING and point #1, a point 50 feet west of the centerline of a woods road;

Thence in a generally southwesterly direction 1,580 feet (digitized) along a line 50 feet northwest of and parallel to the centerline of said woods road to Point #2, a point 50 feet northwest of the centerline of said woods road and 50 feet northerly of the centerline of a woods road that runs in a northwesterly direction;

Thence in a northwesterly direction approximately 4,954 feet (digitized) along a line 50 feet northerly of and parallel to the centerline of the woods road, passing through Section 22 and entering Section 21, T.12S., R.26E., to Point #3, a point 50 feet northerly of the centerline of said woods road and on a line 25 feet northeasterly of and parallel to the north boundary of a slash pine plantation planted in 1976;

Thence in a generally northwesterly direction along a line 25 feet northeast of and parallel to the north boundary of said slash pine plantation, passing through section 21 and entering Section 20, T.12S., R.26E., approximately 3,064 feet (digitized) to Point #4, a point 50 feet east of the centerline of Forest Development Road (FDR) #77-2;

Thence in a generally northwesterly direction 16,114 feet (digitized) along a line 50 feet northeast of and parallel to the centerline of (FDR) #77-2, passing through Sections 20, 17 and 44 and entering Section 45, T.12S., R.26E. to Point #5, a point 50 feet northeast of the centerline of (FDR) #39;

Thence in a generally northwesterly direction 208 feet (digitized) along a line 50 feet northeast of and parallel to the centerline of (FDR) #39 to point #6, a point 50 feet south of the centerline of a woods road;

Thence in a generally easterly direction 8,947 feet (digitized) along a line 50 feet south of and parallel to the centerline of said woods road passing through Section 45 and entering Section 44, T.12S., R.26E., to point #7, a point where said woods road turns southwest around the west side of a small lake;

Thence leaving woods road and running $N55^{\circ}40'E$, 677 feet (digitized) to Point #8 a point on the south bank of a tributary of Bear Creek;

Thence in a generally easterly direction 3,294 feet (digitized) along said south bank of a tributary of Bear Creek to Point #9, a point on the south bank of Bear Creek;

Thence in a generally southeasterly direction 6,247 feet (digitized) along the south bank of Bear Creek to Point #10, a point on the west bank of the St. Johns River at the north end of Little Lake George;

Thence in a southerly direction 14,565 feet (digitized) along the west bank of Little Lake George, passing through Sections 44, 9, 15, 16, 21 and entering Section 22, T.12S., R.26E., to Point #11, a point which is Triangulation Station LEG;

Thence WEST 50 feet to Point #1 and THE POINT OF BEGINNING.

The Little Lake George Wilderness containing in aggregate 2,833 Acres more or less as digitized from the above named quadrangle map.
