


NATIONAL WILDERNESS PRESERVATION SYSTEM

TWIN PEAKS
LEGAL DESCRIPTION

The area included in the Twin Peaks Wilderness is located on the Wasatch National Forest, Intermountain Region, Salt Lake County, Utah, according to the "Utah Wilderness Act of 1984." The official boundary description and maps on which the boundary is shown are on file and available in the offices of the Forest Supervisor, Wasatch-Cache National Forest, Salt Lake City, Utah, and the Regional Forester, Intermountain Region, Ogden, Utah. The wilderness consists of an area of 11,334 acres, more or less. A detailed description of the boundary follows:

Boundary Description:

Beginning at the E1/4 corner Section 25, T. 2 S., R. 1 E., Salt Lake Base and Meridian, Utah;

Thence, northerly along the east section line of Section 25 about 400 feet, to a point 500 feet southerly of the center of Big Cottonwood Creek;

Thence, northeasterly and easterly along a line parallel with and 500 feet southerly of Big Cottonwood Creek to an intersection with the south boundary of the NE1/4SE1/4 of Section 20, T. 2 S., R. 2 E.;

Thence, easterly along the south line of the NE1/4SE1/4 Section 20 to the east section line of said Section 20;

Thence, northerly along said east section line to the west 1/4 corner of Section 21;

Thence, easterly along the south line of S1/2NW1/4 Section 21 to the C1/4 corner of said Section 21;

Thence, northerly along the east line of the S1/2NW1/4 Section 21 to the NE corner of said parcel;

Thence, easterly along the south line of the NW1/4NE1/4 Section 21 to the SE corner of said parcel;

Thence, east to a point 200 feet southerly of the center of Big Cottonwood Creek;

Thence, along a line parallel with and 200 feet southerly of Big Cottonwood Creek to the intersection with a line 33 feet southwesterly of the first ridge crest between Mill B South Fork and Mineral Fork;

Thence, southeasterly along said line parallel with and 33 feet southwesterly from said ridge line for about 2 1/2 miles to the intersection with line 2-3 of Mineral Survey 5388A;

Thence, southerly along line 2-3 of Mineral Survey 5388A to Cor. No. 3 of said mineral survey;

Thence, southeasterly along line 3-4 of Mineral Survey 5388A to the point of intersection 33 feet southwesterly of ridge crest;

Thence, southeasterly along said line parallel with and 33 feet southwesterly of ridge line for about 1 1/4 miles to a point of intersection with line 1-4 of Golden Cliff No. 5 Lode, Mineral Survey 5913 and 33 feet southwesterly of ridge line;

Thence, southeasterly to Cor. 4 of Consolidated Lode of Mineral Survey 5913;

Thence, southerly along line 4-3 of Consolidated Lode, Mineral Survey 5913 to a point 600 feet northerly of the road centerline of State Highway 210;

Thence westerly along a line parallel with and 600 feet northerly from said road centerline for about 3 1/2 miles to an intersection with line 4-3 of Wasatch No. 9 Placer, Mineral Survey 6379;

Thence, northerly along said line to Cor. No. 3 of Wasatch No. 9 Placer, Mineral Survey 6379.

Thence, westerly along the north line of Mineral Surveys 6379 and 6342, for about 2.1 miles to Cor. No. 2 of Wasatch No. 3 Placer, Mineral Survey 6342;

Thence, south 800 feet to corner No. 1 of Wasatch No. 3 Placer;

Thence west 650 feet;

Thence north 650 feet;

Thence west approximately 300 feet to a point due south of corner No. 4 of Glenwood No. 5 Lode, Mineral Survey 5881;

Thence north approximately 4,300 feet to said corner No. 4;

Thence north 2,550 feet;

Thence, west to the east section line of Section 1, T. 3 S., R. 1 E.;

Thence, northerly along the east section line of said Sec. 1 about 425 feet to the SE corner of Section 36, T. 2 S., R. 1 E.;

Thence, westerly along the south line of the E1/2SE1/4, Section 36 to the SW corner of said parcel;

Thence, northerly along the west line of the E1/2SE1/4, Section 36 to the NW corner of said parcel;

Thence, westerly along the south line of the W1/2NE1/4, Section 36 to the C1/4 corner of Section 36;

Thence, northerly along the west line of the W1/2NE1/4, Sec. 36 to a point at elevation 5,500 feet near the north line of said Section 36;

Thence, northeasterly along said 5,500 foot elevation about three-quarters of a mile to the east section line of Section 25, T. 2 S., R. 1 E.;

Thence, northerly along the east section line of said Section 25 to the point of beginning.

Qualifications

All information was taken from 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2' Primary Base Series quadrangle maps which were mapped, edited, and published by the U.S. Geological Survey, and modified by the Forest Service Geomtronics Service Center using 1985 photography and 1985/86 correction guides furnished by the Intermountain Region.

This boundary description has been plotted on a set of U.S. Geological Survey 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2' quadrangle maps which are reduced to a 1-inch-equals-1-mile map entitled "Twin Peaks Wilderness," Wasatch-Cache National Forest, Intermountain Region, dated August 25 1988, which is attached and made part of this description.
