Boundary Description

Beginning at the summit of Red Mountain, elevation 10,508 feet, latitude 41°08'17", longitude 106°59'11", in the Medicine Bow National Forest, Wyoming;

thence northeasterly in a straight line 0.8 mile to the southernmost summit of Doane Peak, elevation 10,278 feet;

thence easterly in a straight line 0.4 mile to a summit with a contour elevation of 10,160 feet;

thence southeasterly in a straight line 0.8 mile to a summit with an elevation of 9,782 feet;

thence easterly in a straight line 0.3 mile to a summit with an elevation of 9,683 feet;

thence due south 0.3 mile to the thread of North Fork Encampment River;

thence northeasterly on the thread of said river 0.6 mile to the confluence, at 8,720 feet in elevation, with a northerly-flowing tributary;

thence southerly on the thread of said tributary 1.2 miles to the confluence of two branches at elevation 9,280 feet;

thence southeasterly on the thread of the east branch of said tributary 1.3 miles to the confluence at elevation 9,730 feet, with an unnamed intermittent westerly-flowing tributary;

thence southeasterly in a straight line 0.8 mile to a summit with a contour elevation of 10,320 feet;

thence easterly in a straight line 0.9 mile to a summit with a contour elevation of 10,160 feet;

thence easterly in a straight line 0.8 mile to a summit with an elevation of 9,811 feet;

thence southeasterly on the hydrographic divide separating drainage from the northwest into South Fork Miner Creek, upstream and downstream of elevation 9,030 feet, 0.8 mile to elevation 9,200 feet;

thence southeasterly in a straight line 0.2 mile to an elevation of 9,030 feet on the thread of said creek;

thence southwesterly on the thread of said creek 0.8 mile to the confluence, at elevation 9,310 feet, of an unnamed, intermittent, northeasterly-flowing tributary;

thence southwesterly on the thread of said tributary 1.2 miles to a point due west of triangulation Station Willow, elevation 10,423 feet;

thence due east 0.4 mile to said triangulation station;

thence southeasterly in a straight line 0.3 mile to a summit with a contour elevation of 10,360 feet;

thence northeasterly in a straight line 0.6 mile to elevation 9,760 feet on the southernmost branch of an unnamed, intermittent, northeasterly-flowing tributary joining North Soldier Creek at elevation 9,300 feet;

thence northeasterly on thread of said branch 0.8 mile to said confluence;

thence due east less than 0.1 mile to the intersection of a line 100 feet west of and parallel to the centerline of the Carbon Power Company powerline right-of-way;

thence southerly on said offset line 0.5 mile to the intersection of a line 100 feet west of and parallel to the centerline of Forest Development Road (FDR) 552F;

thence southwesterly on the road offset line 1.2 miles to the intersection of a line 100 feet west of and parallel to the centerline of said powerline right-of-way;

thence southerly on the powerline offset line 1.8 miles to the line between Township 13 North, and Township 12 North, Sixth Principal Meridian;

thence westerly on said township line 1.2 miles to the southwest corner of Section 31, Township 13 North, Range 84 West;

thence westerly in a straight line 0.9 mile to a summit with an elevation of 8,864 feet;

thence southerly in a straight line 0.1 mile to the confluence at 8,590 feet in elevation, of two unnamed, intermittent branches of an unnamed, easterly-flowing tributary joining Hog Park Creek at 8,390 feet in elevation;

thence westerly on the thread of the southerly branch of said tributary 0.9 mile to the Continental Divide;

thence northerly on said divide 0.9 mile to a summit with an elevation of 9,818 feet;

thence northerly in a straight line 0.7 mile to a summit with a contour elevation of 9,240 feet;

thence northwesterly in a straight line 0.6 mile to a summit with a contour elevation of 9,400 feet at latitude  $41^{\circ}04'28''$ , longitude  $106^{\circ}55'32''$ ;

thence due north 0.1 mile to the intersection with the UTM 4,548,700 meter Y coordinate line;

thence westerly on said coordinate line 3.9 miles to the intersection with the UTM 331,970 meter X coordinate line;

thence northerly on said X coordinate line 0.6 mile to the intersection with the UTM 4,549,700 meter Y coordinate line;

thence westerly on said Y coordinate line 1.1 miles to an elevation of 9,300 feet, near the west line of Section 24, Township 13 North, Range 86 West;

thence southwesterly and northerly on the 9,300 foot contour 7.0 miles to the thread of an unnamed, southwesterly-flowing tributary joining Roaring Fork Little Snake River at 8,800 feet in elevation;

thence southwesterly on thread of said tributary 0.4 mile to the intersection of a line 100 feet north of and parallel to the centerline of Trail 860;

thence westerly on said offset line 1.8 miles to the intersection of a line 100 feet north of and parallel to the centerline of Sheep Mountain Supply Ditch;

thence westerly on said ditch offset line 0.6 mile to a point due south of a summit with an elevation of 8,407 feet;

thence due north 0.2 mile to said summit;

thence southwesterly in a straight line 0.3 mile to a summit with a contour elevation of 8,400 feet;

thence northwesterly in a straight line 0.2 mile to the southeast corner of Section 18, Township 13 North, Range 86 West;

thence westerly on the south line of said Section 0.7 mile to the thread of Battle Creek;

thence northeasterly on the thread of said creek less than 0.1 mile to the confluence at elevation 7,720 feet of an unnamed southerly-flowing tributary;

thence northerly on said tributary 1.0 mile to the intersection of a line 100 feet east of and parallel to the centerline of FDR 811;

thence northerly on said offset line 4.1 miles to the second intersection with a line 100 feet south of and parallel to the centerline of Trail 852 (Fireline Stock Driveway);

thence easterly on said trail offset line 0.5 mile to the thread of Battle Creek;

thence northeasterly on the thread of said creek 1.8 miles to the confluence at 8,710 feet in elevation with an unnamed westerly-flowing tributary;

thence easterly on the hydrographic divide between said tributary and Battle Creek and the hydrographic divide between Battle Creek and Baby Lake Creek, 2.6 miles to the Continental Divide;

thence easterly on the Continental Divide 0.2 mile to the point of beginning.
