In accordance with Section 3(b) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (82 Stat. 906 as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1274), we are pleased to forward the final map and perimeter boundary description for the Rio Chama Wild and Scenic River, in New Mexico, added to the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System by Public Law 100-633, November 7, 1988. This river is jointly administered by the Santa Fe National Forest, Carson National Forest, and the U.S. Department of the Interior's Bureau of Land Management, Taos Field Office, New Mexico.
