In accordance with the Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131-1136) and enabling legislation, we are forwarding a correction to the perimeter boundary description and final map for the Eagle Cap Wilderness our agency transmitted to Congress in 1987. The Eagle Cap Wilderness in Oregon was designated under the Public Law 88-577 (September 3, 1964), with additions under Public Law 92-521 (October 21, 1972), and Public Law 98-328 (June 26, 1984).


The enclosed documents include a letter explaining the error, the perimeter description, and a map that were sent to the Forest Service Washington Office in 1997 with an intent they be transmitted to Congress in a timely manner. Recent discovery of these documents, however, showed that they were never transmitted. Please accept our apologies for this delay. Also enclosed is a map developed in 2017 that shows the correction more clearly.
