


NATIONAL WILDERNESS PRESERVATION SYSTEM

DESERET PEAK WILDERNESS  
LEGAL DESCRIPTION

The area included in the Deseret Peak Wilderness is located on the Wasatch National Forest, Intermountain Region, Tooele County, Utah, according to the "Utah Wilderness Act of 1984." The official boundary description and maps on which the boundary is shown are on file and available in the office of the Forest Supervisor, Wasatch-Cache National Forest, Salt Lake City, Utah, and the Regional Forester, Intermountain Region, Ogden, Utah. The Wilderness consists of an area of 25,215 acres, more or less, and was computed from 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2' quadrangle maps using the Forest's Geographical Information System (GIS). A detailed description of the boundary follows.

Boundary Description:

Beginning at the west 1/4 corner of Section 9, Township 5 South, Range 7 West, Salt Lake Base & Meridian, Tooele County, Utah;

thence south 500.0 feet along said Section line;

thence easterly approximately 3.2 miles along the ridge line between DRY CANYON and DEADMAN CANYON to the top of a peak at approximate elevation 10,330 feet, said peak bears approximately N 48° W, 1,400 feet from VICKORY MOUNTAIN;

thence descending northeasterly and easterly approximately 1.0 mile along a ridge line to a point 50 feet north of a trail;

thence easterly approximately 2,300 feet, 50 feet northerly from and parallel with said trail, to a point 50 feet west of the MACK CANYON - BIG HOLLOW TRAIL near HICKMAN PASS in the NW1/4 of Section 7, T5S R6W;

thence northerly approximately 7.3 miles, 50 feet westerly from and parallel with the MACK CANYON - BIG HOLLOW TRAIL to a point 500 feet southerly from the centerline of the nearest road in SOUTH WILLOW CANYON;

thence westerly approximately 2.0 miles, 500 feet southerly from and parallel with the centerline of said road, to the bottom of SOUTH WILLOW drainage at elevation 7,480 feet;

thence northerly and northeasterly approximately 3,500 feet, 500 feet northerly from and parallel with the centerline of the nearest road in SOUTH WILLOW CANYON to a ridge line at elevation 7,400 feet;

thence ascending northwesterly approximately 1,500 feet along a ridge line to the top of a knob at elevation 8,190 feet;

thence northerly approximately 1,000 feet to the bottom of MINING FORK OF SOUTH WILLOW CANYON at elevation 7,790 feet;

thence approximately N 29° W, 3,300 feet to the top of a knob at approximate elevation 8,930 feet, said knob being Triangulation Station "WILLOW";

thence northerly approximately 3,300 feet along a ridge line to a point 300 feet westerly from the centerline of a road, in the bottom of the drainage from NORTH WILLOW LAKE;

thence northeasterly approximately 1 mile, 300 feet westerly from and parallel with the centerline of said road, to a point 300 feet southerly from the centerline of a road;

thence westerly approximately 2,000 feet, 300 feet southerly from and parallel with the centerline of said road, to the end point of said road in the bottom of a drainage at approximate elevation 6,860 feet;

thence clockwise at a radius of 300 feet to a point northerly from and parallel with said road;

thence easterly approximately 2,800 feet, 300 feet northerly from and parallel with the centerline of a road, to a point 200 feet southerly from the centerline of a road in NORTH WILLOW CANYON;

thence westerly approximately 3,300 feet, 200 feet southerly from and parallel with the centerline of said road, to the bottom of a drainage at approximate elevation 6,840 feet;

thence ascending westerly approximately 1 mile along the bottom of said drainage to the divide between NORTH WILLOW and PASS CANYONS.

thence descending approximately 2,200 feet along the bottom of PASS CANYON to a point 300 feet easterly from the end of the road in said canyon;

thence westerly approximately 1.5 miles, 300 feet southerly from and parallel with said road, to elevation 6,200 feet;

thence approximately S 60° W, 1,700 feet to the northeast corner of Section 31, T3S R7W;

thence southerly approximately 1.7 miles along the protracted east and south lines of said Section 31 to a point which is NORTH from the northern-most corner of patented Mineral Survey No. 6825;

thence south approximately 1,700 feet to the northern most corner of patented Mineral Survey No. 6825;

thence easterly, southerly and westerly along the lines of said mineral survey between private and National Forest System lands to the western-most corner of said mineral survey;

thence WEST approximately 1,400 feet to the east line of Section 1, T4S R8W;

thence south approximately 4.3 miles along the east line of said T4S R8W to a point 300 feet north of a pipeline from ANTELOPE CANYON;

thence northeasterly, southerly and southwesterly maintaining 300 feet from a pipeline and its intake point in ANTELOPE CANYON to the east line of Section 25, T4S R8W;

thence south approximately 400 feet along said section line to the northwest corner of Section 31, T4S R7W;

thence east and south approximately 9,900 feet along the section lines of said Section 31 to elevation 6,080 feet;

thence easterly approximately 1,300 feet along elevation 6,080 feet to the bottom of INDIAN HICKMAN CANYON;

thence westerly approximately 600 feet along the bottom of INDIAN HICKMAN CANYON to elevation 6,000 feet;

thence southwesterly approximately 600 feet along elevation 6,000 feet to the west line of Section 5, T5S R7W;

thence south, east and south approximately 2.0 miles along the boundary between private and National Forest System lands in Sections 5 and 8 to a point at approximate elevation 6,400 feet;

thence northeasterly and southwesterly approximately .8 miles along approximate elevation 6,400 feet, crossing Dry Canyon to the boundary between private and National Forest System lands on the west line of said section 8;

thence south approximately 1,400 feet along the boundary between private and National Forest System lands to the point of beginning;

### Qualifications

All information was taken from 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2' Primary Base Series quadrangle maps which were mapped, edited, and published by the U.S. Geological Survey, and modified by the Forest Service Geomtronics Service Center using 1985 photography and 1986 correction guides furnished by the Intermountain Region.

This boundary description has been plotted on a set of U.S. Geological Survey 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2' quadrangle maps which are reduced to a 1-inch-equals-1-mile map entitled "Deseret Peak Wilderness," Wasatch-Cache National Forest, Intermountain Region, dated September 28, 1984, which is attached and made part of this description.
