WILD & SCENIC RIVER RECREATION AREA
BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION
- WHITE SALMON NATIONAL SCENIC RIVER

The boundary is the exterior line that encompasses the parcels included in this description. All cited Congressionally Designated or other Special Management Area, Mineral Claim, or Sectional land boundaries, or other calls to or along a senior boundary line will be considered as any other controlling monument and will prevail over any bearing or distance cited within this description. Calls to the margin of a road or other corridor shall be to the limit of the right of way. Nomenclature of sectional subdivisions or sectional subdivision corners according to Bureau of Land Management standards and practices is not meant to preclude the acceptance of local or previously established boundary lines, monuments, or other indicia of land tenure that may exist in the vicinity of theoretical sectional subdivision lines or corners. Subdivision of Government Lots into fractions will be by equal area methods, with the exterior lines controlling interior parallel placement, unless prior surveys exist. This description, along with the final map, dated May 11th, 2012, shall be considered as if contained in the original legislation, P.L. 99-663 of November 17, 1986, which created this Wild and Scenic River, and shall govern all boundaries of the Area. Base mapping used to create the attached final map is from the USDA Forest Service Land Status Record System and other corporate data sets.

Section 2; that portion of Gov't Lots 2 and 3 lying northerly of a line parallel with the north line of Gov't Lot 2, said parallel line beginning at the intersection of the southerly margin of Nester Peak Road, also known as Northwestern Lake Road, with the west bank of the White Salmon River, now lying in Northwestern Lake, excepting therefrom, any portion of Gov't Lots 2 and 3 lying southwesterly of the southerly margin of said Nester Peak Road and westerly of the S1/4 corner of Section 35, T. 4 N., R. 10 E., W. Mer.

Section 2; that portion of the S1/2 SE1/4 SE1/4 lying easterly of the westerly margin of State Route 141, White Salmon to Trout Lake Highway.

Section 11; those portions of the E1/2 E1/2 lying easterly of the westerly margin of State Route 141, White Salmon to Trout Lake Highway.

Section 12; All of the NW1/4 SW1/4 NW1/4, S1/2 SW1/4 NW1/4, NW1/4 NE1/4 SW1/4, S1/2 NE1/4 SW1/4, NW1/4 SW1/4 SE1/4, S1/2 SW1/4 SE1/4, inclusive, and those portions of the SW1/4 lying easterly of the westerly margin of State Route 141, White Salmon to Trout Lake Highway.

Section 13; those portions of the section lying easterly of the westerly margin of State Route 141, White Salmon to Trout Lake Highway.

Section 24; those portions of the E1/2 E1/2 lying easterly of the westerly margin of State Route 141, White Salmon to Trout Lake Highway.

Section 25; All of the SW1/4 SW1/4, E1/2 SW1/4, S1/2 SW1/4 SE1/4, E1/2 SE1/4, inclusive, and those portions of the E1/2 NE1/4 lying easterly of the westerly margin of State Route 141, White Salmon to Trout Lake Highway, and those portions of the S1/2 S1/2 SE1/4 NE1/4 lying westerly of the westerly margin of State Route 141, White Salmon to Trout Lake Highway.

Section 26; All of the E1/2 SE1/4 SE1/4.

Section 35; All of the NE1/4 NE1/4, SE1/4 NW1/4 NE1/4, W1/2 SE1/4 NE1/4, E1/2 SW1/4 NE1/4, SE1/4 SE1/4 NE1/4, NE1/4 SE1/4, E1/2 NW1/4 SE1/4, SW1/4 NW1/4 SE1/4, SW1/4 SE1/4, W1/2 SE1/4 SE1/4.

Section 36; All of the NE1/4 NW1/4 NW1/4, N1/2 NE1/4 NW1/4, SE1/4 NE1/4 NW1/4, N1/2 NE1/4, SW1/4 SW1/4 NW1/4, and that portion of the W1/2 NW1/4 NW1/4 lying north of Fordyce County Road as identified in Record of Survey, Vol. 10, page 664, records of Klickitat County, AFN 1012039.

Section 18; All of Gov't Lot 2, and the W1/2 of Gov't Lots 1, 3 and 4, the W1/2 E1/2 of Gov't Lots 1 and 4, and those portions of the N1/2 E1/2 E1/2 of Gov't Lot 1 and the N1/2 NE1/4 NW1/4 lying westerly of the westerly margin of Oak Ridge County Road right of way.

Section 19; All of Gov't Lots 1-4, inclusive, and those portions of the SW1/4 NE1/4 NW1/4, SE1/4 NW1/4, NE1/4 SW1/4, and NW1/4 SE1/4 SW1/4 lying westerly of the west margin of Oak Ridge County Road right of way and northerly of its' northerly margin at a sharp bend above a westerly-flowing drainage from Tum Tum peak.

Section 30; All of Gov't Lots 2 and 4, and the W1/2 of Gov't Lots 1 and 3, that portion of the NE1/4 SW1/4 lying easterly of the easterly margin of Oak Ridge County Road right of way, that portion of the SE1/4 SW1/4 lying southeasterly of the southeasterly margin of the Oak Ridge County Road right of way and northerly of the southerly margin of the Indian Creek County Road right of way, that portion of the W1/2 W1/2 SE1/4 lying northerly of the northwesterly margin of the right of way for the Public Utility District Double Wood Pole Power Line and the southerly margin of Indian Creek County Road right of way.

Section 31; All of Gov't Lot 1, and that portion of the NE1/4 NW1/4 lying northerly of the southerly margin of Indian Creek County Road right of way.

Subject: White Salmon National Scenic River Boundary

To: Chief

Enclosed are information packets on the proposed boundary for the White Salmon River, in Washington, an "instantly designated and classified" component of the national Wild and Scenic Rivers system, provided for in the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area Act (P.L. 99-663). These packets are for boundary transmittal to Congress.

A notice of transmittal was issued in the Federal Register, January 25, 1990, informing the public that these boundaries would be forwarded to Congress. The decision on delineation of river corridor boundaries, based on an Environmental Assessment and the provision that the boundaries would be addressed in the Final Environmental Impact Statement, was signed on February 24, 1989, by Arthur DuFault, National Scenic Area Manager. Subsequent appeals of the decision were overruled. Unless changed by Congress, this boundary decision will be implemented 90 days after Congress receives this transmittal.

Enclosed are the requested 21 copies of the packets, including one copy for the Recreation files and ten copies for each House. These packets contain a map and summary of the boundary, as well as copies of the Federal Register and decision notices.



Enclosed are copies of maps and summary information for the draft river corridor boundaries for the Kickitat National Recreation River and the White Salmon National Scenic River, Washington. Both rivers were "instantly designated" last November by the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area Act (PL 99-663). To meet the timeline provided by the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act, as amended, boundaries should be established by November 17 of this year.

Critical in meeting this timeline, as well as maintaining the momentum of our Wild and Scenic Rivers program, is your review. We are requesting WO review and comments of the draft boundaries by November 3. After final public comments are analyzed we will discuss any proposed changes with Tom Lennon, before the Nov. 13 printing of the notice of availability in the Federal Register and the reproductions of the final maps.
