


NATIONAL WILDERNESS PRESERVATION SYSTEM

TETON WILDERNESS ADDITION  
LEGAL DESCRIPTION

The area included in the Teton Wilderness Addition is located on the Teton National Forest, Intermountain Region, Teton County, Wyoming, according to the "Wyoming Wilderness Act of 1984." The official boundary description and maps on which the boundary is shown are on file and available in the offices of the Forest Supervisor, Bridger-Teton National Forest, Jackson, Wyoming, and the Regional Forester, Intermountain Region, Ogden, Utah. The Teton Wilderness consists of a total area of 584,740 acres, more or less, and was computed from 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2' quadrangle maps using the Forest's Geographical Information System (GIS). A detailed description of the boundary follows.

Boundary Description:

Beginning at a point on the east bank of the Snake River common to the east boundary of the John B. Rockefeller, Jr., Memorial Parkway and the south boundary of Yellowstone National Park;

thence, east along the Yellowstone National Park boundary to a point on the westerly boundary of the existing Teton Wilderness;

thence, generally southerly along the westerly boundary of the existing Teton Wilderness to a point on a summit having elevation 8,064, said point bears northerly approximately 0.33 miles from Pilgrim Mountain;

thence, east along said Wilderness boundary approximately 4,900 feet to an angle point;

thence, south along said boundary 2,640 feet;

thence, west 1,320 feet;

thence, south approximately 2,640 feet to the Grand Teton National Park boundary;

thence, west along said boundary to the E-W 1/64 corner of Sections 24 and 25, T. 46 N., R. 115 W.;

thence, north 1,200 feet

thence, west approximately 2,100 feet to the Grand Teton National Park boundary;

thence, north along said boundary approximately 3.0 miles to a point, said point bears north along the Grand Teton National Park boundary 1,200 feet from the SW corner of Section 1, T. 46 N., R. 115 W.;

thence, east 1,850 feet

thence, north 1,650 feet

thence, west approximately 1,850 feet to the Grand Teton National Park boundary;

thence, north along said boundary to the NW corner of Section 36; T. 47 N., R. 115 W.;

thence, west along said boundary to the SW corner of Section 27;

thence north along said boundary to the NW corner of Section 15;

thence, west along said boundary approximately 1.1 miles to the easterly boundary of the John D. Rockefeller, Jr., Memorial Parkway;

thence, northerly along said Parkway boundary approximately 3,300 feet to an angle point near the top of a knob at approximate elevation 7,780 feet;

thence, northeasterly along the said Parkway boundary to a point on Sheffield Creek;

thence, northwesterly along Sheffield Creek and said Parkway boundary to a point, said point bears southerly along Sheffield Creek 1,350 feet from the intersection of Sheffield Creek with the Sheffield Creek Road;

thence, east 1,000 feet;

thence, north 3,000 feet;

thence, west approximately 1,350 feet to the easterly boundary of the John D. Rockefeller, Jr., Memorial Parkway;

thence, northerly along said Parkway boundary to the point of beginning.

### Qualifications

All information was taken from 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2' Primary Base Series quadrangle maps which were mapped, edited, and published by the U.S. Geological Survey, and modified by the Forest Service Geomtronics Service Center using 1982, 1983 and 1991 photography and 1987, 1991 correction guides furnished by the Intermountain Region.

This boundary description has been plotted on a set of U.S. Geological Survey 1:24,000 scale 7 1/2' quadrangle maps which are reduced to a 1-inch-equals-1-mile map entitled "Teton Wilderness", Teton Addition (Corridor) Bridger-Teton National Forest, Intermountain Region, dated April 28, 1984, which is attached and made part of this description.
